Congratulations Councillor Gavin Harding MBE

Gavin Harding who is thought to be Britain's first councillor and deputy mayor with learning difficulties has been made an MBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours.

Gavin Harding's disabilities have not prevented him first becoming a Selby town councillor in 2011 and then recently the town's deputy mayor.

Gavin Harding is a founder member and a former co-chair of the National Forum of People with Learning Disabilities.

Today as well as being Councillor and Deputy Mayor, Councillor Gavin Harding MBE is a trustee for Selby District AVS and the Vice Chair for Voices for People in Selby, a group of adults with learning disabilities and their supporters. Voices for People actively encourage people with a learning difficulty to speak up, advocate for themselves and their peer group.



The former Brayton High School and Selby College student said today he was 'pleased and honoured' to accept his MBE on behalf of everyone with learning difficulties.

He said he had been one of the first pupils in the country to enter a Special Educational Needs unit within a secondary school, attending mainstream lessons, and then at Selby College he was the first person with learning difficulties to become Vice President of the Students Union.

We call our Health and Wellbeing programmes 'Feel Good'. That's because they make people feel good in their bodies and their minds. The Feel Good approach was launched in 2013 by a group of adults with learning disabilities and a dance and movement psychotherapist working at Purple Patch.

Feel Good programmes are a 3 hour long workshop that happen once a week. They involve gentle dance based exercise and visual arts to promote relaxation. Feel Good programmes cost £21 per week (which works out at £7 per hour).

Cash 4 Clubs is a sports grants scheme which gives clubs a chance to win grants ranging from £250 to £1,000, whether it be to improve facilities, purchase new equipment, gain coaching qualifications, or generally invest in the sustainability of their club.

CAS due

The Cash 4 Clubs scheme is funded by Betfair and is supported by SportsAid. Betfair and SportsAid have worked in partnership for a number of years and both organisations understand the importance of community sport in promoting an active lifestyle and stimulating local pride. Betfair's vision is to be a champion of regional and community sport, with Cash 4 Clubs fitting in as part of its much broader community investment programme. Betfair is committed to giving money to charities and supporting sports development both in this country and overseas.

There are four tiers of grants at £250, £500, £750 and £1,000 which are awarded on a discretionary basis.

Any sports club can apply as long as they are registered with their sport's National Governing Body or local authority. Funding can be requested for anything that will add to the sustainability and effectiveness of the sports club.

Grants are awarded once a year after selection by our committee. The judges include representatives from Betfair, SportsAid, and other independent and sports committee members.

The next round of applications will open on 1 September until 30 September 2014.

Horton Housing Association provides a range of supported housing, day support and training services in a manner that promotes self-esteem, respect and Independence to people disadvantaged by housing and social circumstances, discrimination, financial exclusion and other forms of social need.

The GaTEWAY Site Management (GSM) services cater for long stay residential sites for Gypsy and Travellers who are in need of appropriate housing; the scheme comprises four caravan sites in North Yorkshire. GSM provide a repairs and maintenance service and is also available to provide help and support with Housing Benefit claims and personal charges payments. GaTEWAY also offers support services for occupants via GaTEWAY Floating Support Service.

We are currently seeking a Site Assistant to work across our sites in Selby, Thirsk and Stokesley. The main purpose of this role is to support the day-to-day operational management of GaTEWAY Sites in North Yorkshire. This will include maintaining property and tenant files, helping to ensure tenants comply with the terms of their licence agreement and promoting tenant applications by helping potential applicants to complete paperwork. You will encourage 'good neighbour' relationships between tenants and provide support, information, guidance and practical assistance where necessary. Promoting the service to potential tenants, you will strive to create a safe and welcoming environment for tenants and visitors. You will be expected to undertake housing management duties such as tenancy enforcement, rent collection and recording, reporting repairs, minimising voids etc.

The successful candidate will have experience of housing management and providing housing and tenancy related support. It is essential that you have vocational qualifications relating to health and safety, safeguarding or housing management. Friendly and approachable, you will have an understanding of the kinds of problems faced by marginalised groups and a basic knowledge of domestic violence and/or child protection issues. It would be advantageous for you experience of working with the Gypsy and Traveller community. You will be required to travel to different locations as part of this role so a full UK driving license and access to a vehicle for work purposes is essential.

Our clients are people who are unable to use public transport easily. We transport people for reasons including doctor, hospital, dentist and optician appointments, banking, shopping hairdressers and other social events.

- Volunteer drivers use their own vehicles to transport clients to various destinations.
- Bookings have to be made at least 48 hours (two days) in advance.
- All fees are payable to the driver on the completion of your journey

Do you struggle to use What it costs

There is an annual membership fee payable on your first journey.

Annual membership is £12.00 per annum payable on 1st April or a half year fee of £6.00 payable from 1st October each year.

Clients pay a booking fee and a set mileage rate to help towards the running cost of the volunteer driver's vehicle.

- A £2.00 booking fees charged for each journey.
- A Mileage rate of 45p per mile will be charged.



Voluntary and Community Groups may hire a minibus to transport their members to group meetings or on social outings. Minibus's are available 7 days a week and seat up to 12,14 or 16 passengers
